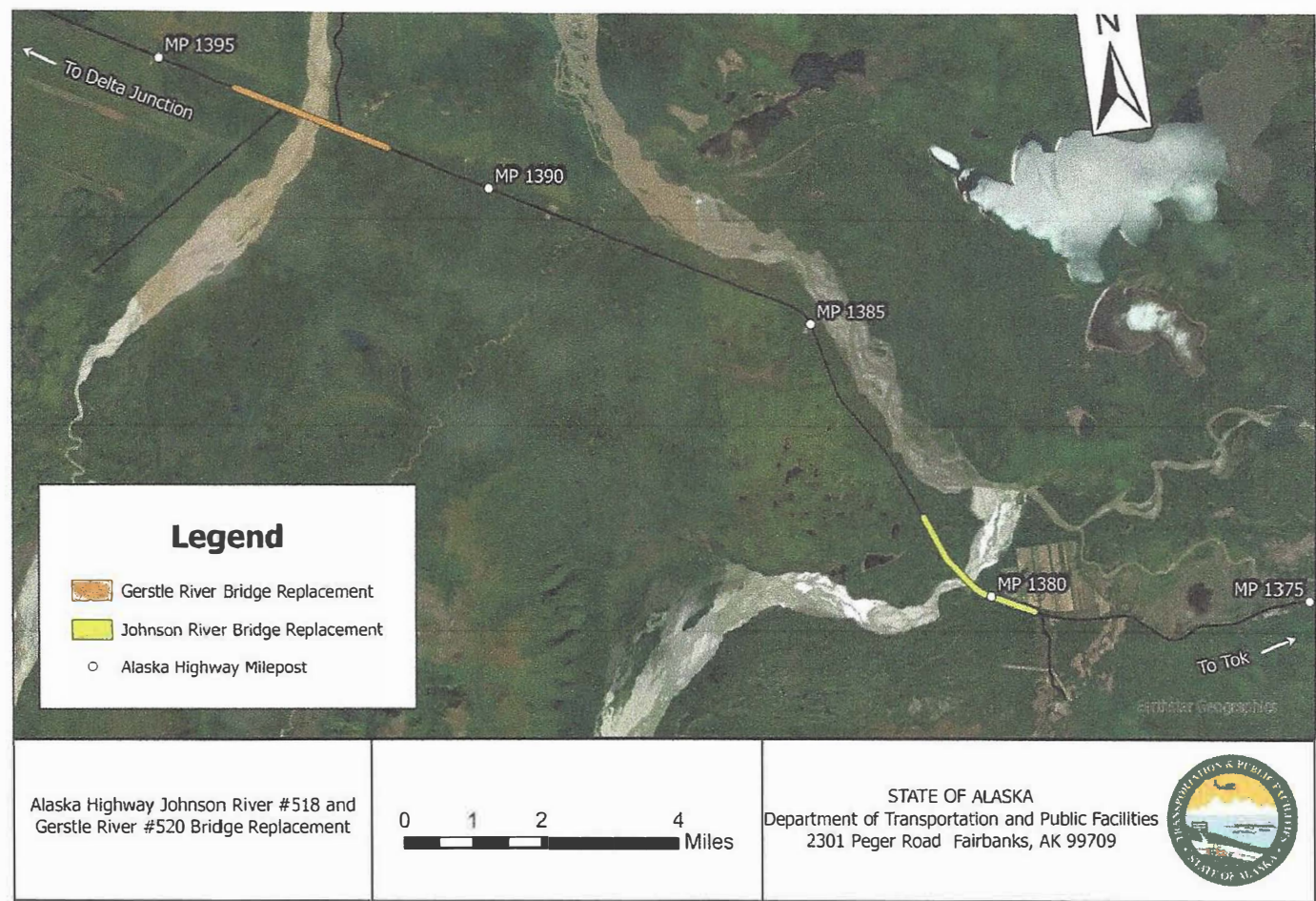
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Project Scope:

Replace the Johnson River Bridge #518 (MP 1380) and the Gerstle River Bridge #520 (MP 1393) on the Alaska Highway. This project will be completed in two stages, and will include rehabilitation of the Alaska Highway, drainage improvements, roadside hardware, and utilities.

Project Purpose:

The purpose of this project is to replace the Johnson River and the Gerstle River Bridges to eliminate load restricted bridges on a primary overland route from Canada to Alaska, as well as extend the service life of the road surface. This project will be constructed over two separate project stages, with the first stage replacing the Johnson River Bridge and the second stage replacing the Gerstle River Bridge.





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today. In addition, the Jonnson River bridge has maintenance and repair needs that require rehabilitation or (in this case) replacement. These bridges need to be upgraded to support important economic development and efficient delivery of goods to Interior Alaska, and improve safety for the traveling public.

Project Status:

The Alaska Highway Bridge Replacement project is currently in the preliminary design and environmental reconnaissance stage. The Department is considering Construction Manager / General Contractor (CMGC) to accelerate construction. Outreach related to CMGC is expected in 2023, along with detailed design work and environmental permitting. The Johnson River Bridge Replacement is currently anticipated to enter construction in 2024. Construction funding has not yet been identified for the Gerstle River Bridge Replacement, so an anticipated construction timeline has yet to be determined for this stage of the project.
